

Day 1: The Word in the Beginning (John 1:1-5*)

• Question: John 1:1 says, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."What do you think John means by calling Jesus "the Word"? How does this verse help us understand who Jesus is?

Day 2: The Light and the Darkness (John 1:6-13)

• Question: John describes Jesus as "the true light that gives light to everyone." (v. 9) What do you think it means that Jesus is the light? How can His light shine in your life?

Day 3: The Word Became Flesh (John 1:14-18)

• Question: John 1:14 says, "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us." Why is it important that Jesus became human? How does this show God's love for us?

Day 4: John the Baptist's Mission (John 1:19-28)

• Question: John the Baptist said he was "the voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way for the Lord.'" (v. 23) What was John's mission, and how can we also prepare the way for Jesus in our lives?

Day 5: Jesus, the Lamb of God (John 1:29-34)

• Question: In verse 29, John the Baptist calls Jesus "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" What does this title mean? How does Jesus take away our sins?

Day 6: Jesus Calls His First Disciples (John 1:35-42)

• Question: When Jesus meets Simon, He gives him a new name, Peter (v. 42). Why do you think Jesus changed his name? What does this tell us about how Jesus transforms lives?

Day 7: Come and See! (John 1:43-51)

• Question: Philip tells Nathanael, "Come and see." (v. 46) What do you think this teaches us about inviting others to know Jesus? How can you invite someone to "come and see" Jesus today?

BONUS REFLECTION QUESTIONS - For deeper reflection:

Bonus 1: What Does This Chapter Teach You About God?

• Question: After reading John 1, what do you learn about God's character? How does this chapter help you understand who He is and how He works in the world?

Bonus 2: How Can You Apply This to Your Life?

• Question: In what ways does John 1 challenge or encourage you? What changes do you need to make in your life to better align with God's character and will?



Chapter 2

Day 1: Jesus Turns Water into Wine (John 2:1-5)

• Question: When Mary tells Jesus about the problem at the wedding, He responds, "My hour has not yet come." (v. 4) What do you think Jesus meant by this? What does this teach us about God's timing?

Day 2: The First Miracle (John 2:6-11)

• Question: Jesus' first miracle was turning water into wine. What does this miracle reveal about His power and His care for people's needs? How can this encourage you in your own life?

Day 3: Jesus Clears the Temple (John 2:12-17)

• Question: When Jesus saw people misusing the temple, He became angry and cleared them out (v. 15). What does this tell us about how God wants us to treat His house and worship Him?

Day 4: Zeal for God's House (John 2:17)

• Question: The disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house will consume me." (Psalm 69:9) What does it mean to have zeal for God? How can you show passion for honoring God in your daily life?

Day 5: The Sign of Jesus' Authority (John 2:18-22)

• Question: Jesus told the religious leaders, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days." (v. 19) He was talking about His body. Why is Jesus' resurrection so important for our faith?

Day 6: Many Believed in Jesus (John 2:23-25)

• Question: People saw Jesus' miracles and believed in Him, but Jesus knew their hearts (v. 24-25). What does this teach us about the difference between true faith and just being amazed by miracles?

Day 7: Personal Reflection

• Question: What is one lesson from John 2 that stands out to you the most? How can you apply it to your life this week?

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Bonus 2: How Can You Apply This to Your Life?

• Question: In what ways does John 1 challenge or encourage you? What changes do you need to make in your life to better align with God's character and will?
